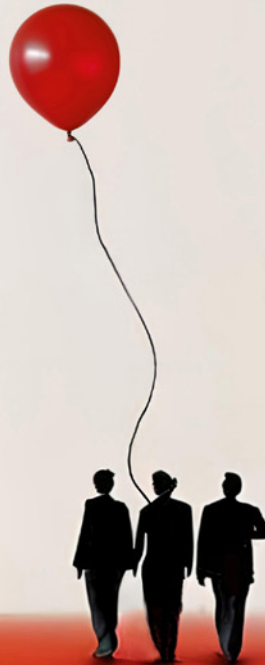

HOPE

who will turn the tide

Optimism is not the belief that things will somehow work out, but rather the confidence in our ability to influence and bring about improvement. And that perhaps best describes the essence of the principle of hope: not as a passive position, but as an active force that motivates us to keep going despite adversity.

But don't worry, this year's festival will not be an examination of the psychological or even evolutionary foundations of the principle of hope, nor will it be a reflection on our unsteady fluctuation between hope and pessimism.

"HOPE" as a festival theme is not a resigned statement that all we can do is hope that someone or something will solve our problems, but rather a manifestation that there are actually many reasons for hope. This is expressed in the subtitle "who will turn the tide", which does not claim to know how the turnaround can be achieved, but rather focuses on who the driving forces behind this turnaround are.

The festival's goal is to spotlight as many people as possible who have already set out on their journey and whose activities—no matter how big or small—are a tangible reason to have hope.

Believing in the possibility of change is the prerequisite for bringing about positive change, especially when all signs point to the fact that the paths we are currently taking are often dead ends.

But belief alone will not be enough; it requires a combination of belief, vision, cooperation, and a willingness to take concrete action. A willingness that we need, even if we are not yet sure how we will turn the tide, how we will solve the problems, and how we will deal with the effects of the problems that we are (no longer) able to solve.

Yes, technology will not solve our problems, but a lot of technology will be needed to address the problems. But this requires a different understanding both of technology and of our responsibility for using technology. But such visions must not be used as an excuse not to act; they must not tempt us to sit back and wait for the "super technology that solves everything".

"HOPE" as the festival motto also poses an important question about the role and tasks of a festival in challenging times and is seen as a clear statement against the stupid, short-sighted pseudo-concepts and fake arguments of populist politics, against the nonsense-causing cries the mass media swamps (analog and digital), as well as against meaningless whitewashing and ignoring things.

To some, this appears to be a "crisis of imagination" because they no longer see large, spectacular plans for the future. But what has changed is not the power of imagination, the visionary courage, but the perspective. The spectacular and radical ideas are suddenly no longer concerned with growth, but with reduction. The diagram that shows the dramatic curve in which we must reduce CO2 emissions in the next few years has become a new icon, the radicalness of which also shows how radical our ideas must be. What courage it takes to even think about this radicalism without losing heart.

Hope is the opposite of fear, but there are many reasons to be afraid. The Ars Electronica Festival 2024 will show that there are also many reasons for hope—people, many people, who have started working to bring about change with their ideas, projects, actions, and attitudes.

Young architects who no longer want to build new houses but rather renew the existing infrastructure; villagers that successfully practice zero-waste; industrial designers who base their concepts on reuse instead of recycling and not only think about new materials, but also design the necessary changes in the design of the products; African open source communities of computer scientists who do not want to leave powerful AI systems in the hands of just a few large corporations.

But also technical visionaries who are developing new, more efficient forms of energy generation; economists who design new models of a socially and globally fair distribution of work and profits in a future characterized by automation and digital systems; people who are not committed to the dismantling but to the further development of democracy; seniors who fight together with their grandchildren for the human right to climate protection; artists who design gardens for insects, etc., etc., etc.

First you are amazed at how much is already happening around the world, and then hope arises. HOPE—who will turn the tide.

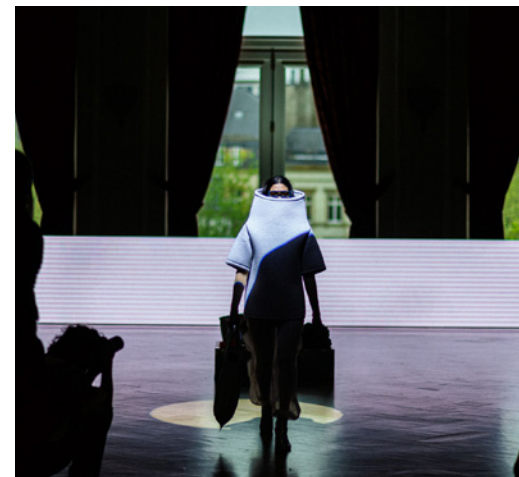

In Fabio Machiavelli’s *Machines Inside Me*, three self-built electromechanical instruments play together with two performers. The instruments are equipped with automated mechanical components controlled by an Arduino processor, which has been programmed to allow the instruments to interact and assist the human performers during the performance of the piece. The electromechanical components follow their own “score”, synchronizing with the human performers.

Have you ever had a song stuck in your head? Or is it rather that fancy dress you saw in a shop window and cannot forget? *SUPERIMPOSITION* explores the concept of earworms, combined with data analysis to select the most characteristic lyrics. Their mathematically generated superimposition composes the work: a composition in which no melody is recognizable. This concept is conceived as a performative act, a fashion show that recalls ancient rituals in which the performers and the audience become a single body on stage. The garments are made of sound-absorbing fabrics, layering music and fashion to result in an unusual performance.

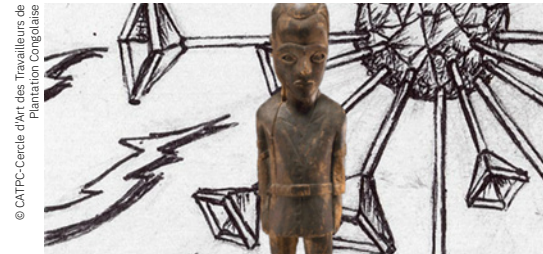
Who decides what historical events a society remembers, and how? What is celebrated as Cultural Heritage, and what isn't? Where is Cultural Heritage preserved and whose version of history is correct? These are some of the questions that the STARTS Exhibition explores. It gives space to voices and perspectives that have thus far often been ignored or oppressed—also in the discussions around Cultural Heritage. Two projects are especially impressive: they engage with the restitution of African cultural artifacts and pose questions about European colonialism, violence and sovereignty.

CATPC: Cercle d'Art des Travailleurs de Plantation Congolaise (CD) Balot NFT

Balot NFT—STARTS Prize Africa Grand Prize winner—documents the work of Congolese artist collective CATPC, which consists of plantation workers. Their

goal is to reconstitute the “Balot” figure, build a museum and reclaim the land and artworks that were stolen by the Belgian colonial rulers. This mission is financed by selling NFTs of the figure. In this way, it digitally becomes the workers' possession once more: technology turns into a vehicle for decolonializing Cultural Heritage.

Reclaiming Cultural Heritage is also the topic of *Metadata Memoir*. During the British invasion of Southern Nigeria in 1897, over 4,000 secular and sacred artifacts were stolen: the Benin Bronzes. Now scattered across more than 160 museums and cultural institutions, individual artefacts are slowly being restituted. In the process, a lot of information about the Bronzes has been lost and restitution mostly happens below the public radar. Atairu has developed a smart contract that automates the real-time documentation of returned Benin Bronzes, stores the information and makes it available in a single archive. Cultural Heritage is not just a topic for museums and governments: it concerns us all.

Whose cultural heritage is archived is a core question of the project *Black Movement Library* led by US-American artist LaJuné McMillian. Access to software for creating animations has significantly improved over the last years; however, it often lacks data to depict movements of diverse characters. The *Black Movement Library* offers an archive of the movements of Black people which can be used by other artists, activists, and performers for their own work. This allows more diverse and inclusive XR projects to be created. Immerse yourself in the work of the archive and follow the portraits in the videos!

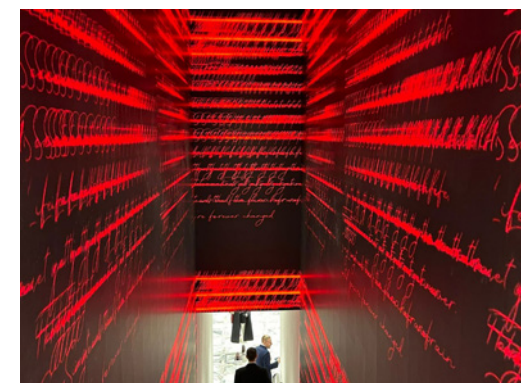
How do artists apply AI in their work? Does AI become a co-creator or does it remain a pure tool? How do artists connect AI to our world and explore its effects on our reality? The projects awarded with the Prix Ars Electronica in the newly created category AI in ART explore these questions. The Golden Nica winner, director and video maker Paul Trillo created the first fully AI-generated music video for the song *The Hardest Part* by Washed Out (Ernest Greene). Using OpenAI's model Sora, which automatically translates text to video, Trillo tells the story of a lost love. The video not only imitates reality, it paints a disconcerting picture by integrating surreal memories that merge with each other.

These powerful tools constantly create new meanings and emotions by means of revival, reappraisal and reinvention.

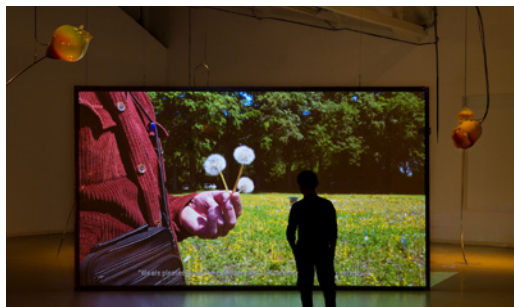

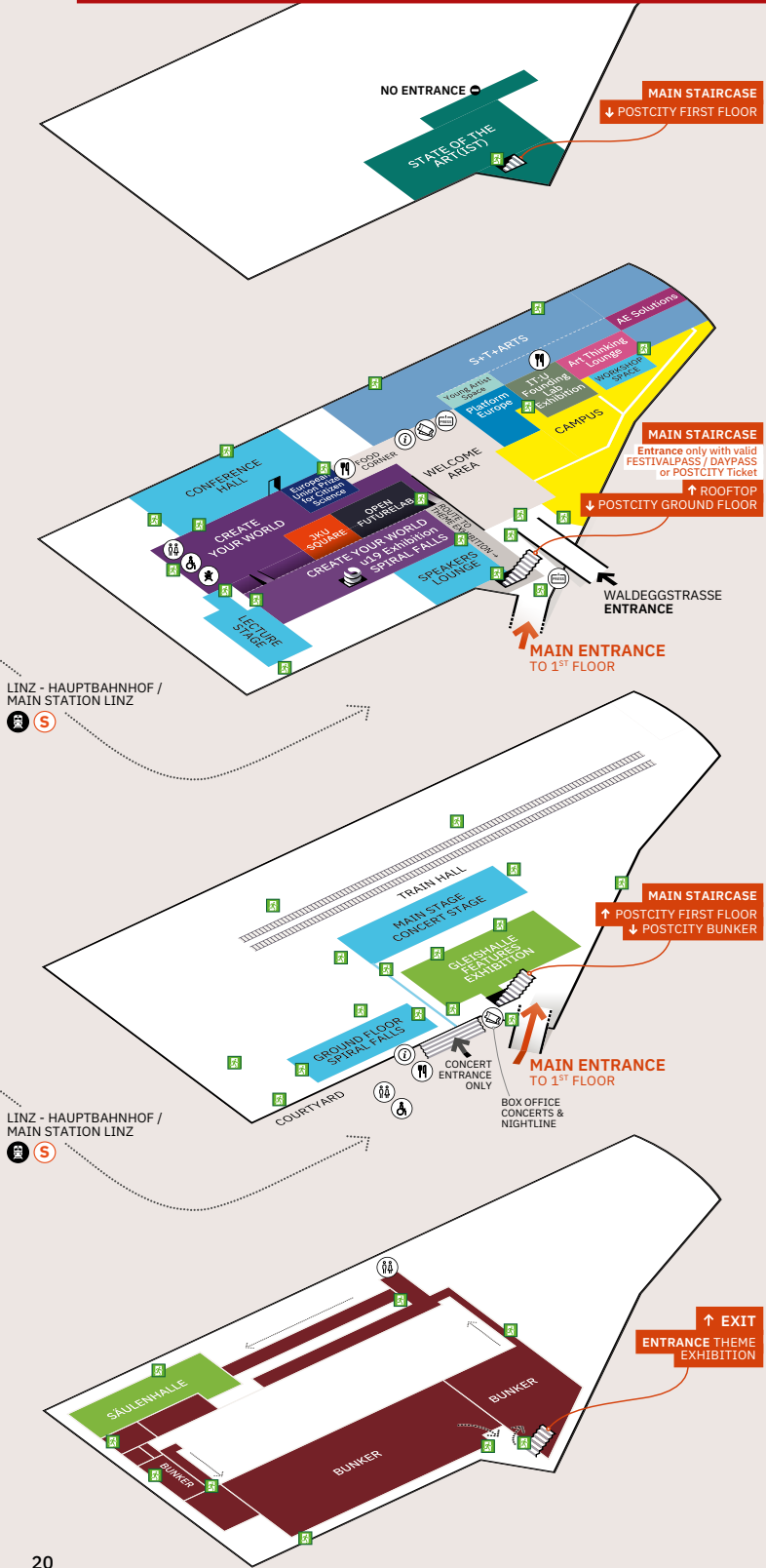

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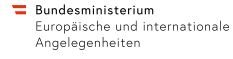
