Deep Space LIVE: Tracing the Green Roof of Europe

(Linz, 14.10.2019) Enchanted marshlands, mysterious moors, primeval forest relics and untouched river valleys: Thursday evening, 17.10.2019, nature photographer Berndt Fischer presents breathtaking high-resolution photos from the region of the Bavarian-Austrian-Czech border: from the German Fichtelgebirge to the Upper Austrian Bohemian Forest. Beginning is at 7 p.m.

Berndt Fischer

Berndt Fischer was born in 1949 in Amberg, Germany. For 40 years he has been photographing - most of all landscapes and animals, but also cities and people. A three-year stay in Paris was followed by his first illustrated book "Paris - Magic of a City". Since then he has written 5 more illustrated books and countless reports about his Franconian adopted country and photo trips on 4 continents. Berndt Fischer is also politically active and understands his photography, which he came to as an autodidact, as a statement against the progressive destruction of nature.
