## **Submissions for S+T+ARTS Prize 2023 open today**

**(Linz/Brussels, 11.1.2023) Artists, scientists, technologists, institutions, labs and companies can now submit their best projects for the European Commission's prestigious S+T+ARTS Prize 2023.**

S+T+ARTS stands for Science, Technology and Arts and is an initiative of the European Commission. It aims to combine technology and artistic practice in the best possible way. As part of this initiative, the S+T+ARTS Prize recognizes the most promising collaborations at the interface of science, technology and the arts. The European Commission's S+T+ARTS Prize is announced and carried out by a consortium, including Linz-based Ars Electronica in a leading role. Since 2016, the prestigious prize has honored more than 200 projects from 14,291 submissions from 96 countries and distributed a total of 280,000 euros in prize money.

### **The S+T+ARTS Prize 2023**

Once again, innovative and groundbreaking work and collaborations that help to master Europe's social, ecological and economic challenges are in demand. Thematically, the 2023 focus is on interdisciplinary projects that explore creative data and media innovations, as well as work that explores hybrid formats, disruptive technologies, or next-generation media storytelling initiatives.

### **Two prizes of 20,000 euros each**

Two prizes of 20,000 euros each await the winners. The "Grand Prize - Innovative Collaboration" rewards innovative collaboration between industry or technology and the artistic (and creative) field. And the "Grand Prize - Artistic Exploration" honors artistic research and works that have the potential to influence or change the use, application or perception of technology. In addition to the prize money, there are also the coveted S+T+ARTS Prize Trophies and appearances at the partner institutions to be won.

### **Submissions until March 3**

Submissions for the S+T+ARTS Prize will begin on January 11, 2023, and the deadline for submissions is March 3, 2023. The European Commission Prize is announced and organized by Ars Electronica, Bozar, Waag, INOVA+, T6 Ecosystems, French Tech Grande Provence and the Frankfurt Book Fair.
